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The descant does not appear in the Farm Street sources, and may never have been sung there (though it was sung in concerts given by the Bec Singers under the direction of Paul Inwood in the 1970s), but it does appear in another manuscript, described in Magnificat Music edition MM102, and has therefore been included here for the sake of completeness.


